



CONSUMER INFORMATION





Reinforcement of producers' consumer information obligations

- ➤ Creation of a **reparability index from 2021** and a sustainability index from 2024
- ➤ Obligation to provide information on the availability of spare parts
- ➤ Obligation to affix an information on the rules for sorting products
- ➤ Obligation to provide information on the presence of endocrine disruptors in products

END OF DISPOSABLE PLASTIC






End of disposable plastic in 2040 and other objectives

- Registration of the end of placing on the market of single-use plastic packaging by 2040
- Aim to "move towards" 100% recycled plastic by 2025
- Creation by 2021 of a re-use observatory
- Prohibition of a series of single-use plastic products: straws, cutlery, stirrers, sandwich boxes, beverage lids, balloon rods, confetti and steak spades.

CIRCULAR PUBLIC PROCUREMENT





Towards a circular public procurement


- ➤ Obligation for public purchasers to buy goods that are reused or that incorporate recycled materials (20% to 100% depending on the product).
- ➤ Possibility for public authorities to make donations in order to avoid waste generation

The missing component of buyer support:

Availability of LCA tools / circular economy criteria and standard clauses / training of buyers


EXTENDED PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY






Important reforms in Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR)

- Extension of the missions of the EPR sectors
- ➤ Modulation of eco-contributions in the form of a **bonus-malus on products' prices**, based on environmental performance criteria
- Creation of funds dedicated to the financing of repair, and funds dedicated to the financing of reuse
- ➤ Creation of a "Stakeholder Committee" for EPR schemes with local authorities, environmental associations...
- Creation of new EPR sectors and extension of existing ones





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
